Effective Jan. 1, 2010, Florida law requires all applicants for a driver's license or identification card to present the following identification documents: An original birth certificate, valid U.S. passport, or original

Certificate of Naturalization as well as other information (visit www.flhsmv.gov for more information).

Currently, the only way to change your address for your driver's license is to visit the DMV in Live Oak at 215 Pine Ave SW. It is open Monday–Friday, 7:30 a.m.–5:00 p.m.

Scam Tip of the Week: Florida Tolls Scam

A popular scam right now is a text that reads something similar to "Florida Toll Services, our records show that your vehicle has an outstanding toll charge. To prevent further fees totaling \$75.59, please settle the due amount of \$7.59 at mysunpasstollsinvoices.com." If you receive a text similar to this, delete it. If your phone allows you to report the text as well, go ahead and do that. Whatever you do, don't click on the link. SunPass posted a warning on its website, warning customers the messages were not sent by SunPass and are a phishing scam targeting the public. "SunPass does not ask customers via text to make a payment or to take immediate action on their account."

#### FROM BAGS TO BEDS

We had a great meeting last week. We had a new volunteer stop by to learn how to fold the bags. The participation in this program, I feel, is great. We have all the lovely people that donate bags. (This is an important part because without bags, we have no program.) We have people who fold the bags into fourths, whether at home or at meetings. (I can think of a dozen volunteers who fold bags at meetings; we average three to six volunteers at a meeting, and that's awesome.) I usually cut the bags into fourths while the volunteers fold them.

It takes 100 pieces in a bag to pass on to the weavers to make a ball of plarn. We have one person at our meetings and about three volunteers who do it at home. It takes approximately eight balls of plarn to be crocheted into a mat. At this time, we have one woman who crochets mats and another awaiting instructions on how to crochet a mat.

It may sound like a lot of weight is put on this one person's shoulders, but we do not put that kind of pressure on a person. I take the plarn balls into the head of our plarn ministry. She, plus two other women, also crochets mats, pillows, and water bottle holders. Isn't this an amazing process?

It takes approximately 200 bags to make a mat. We need bags to keep these diligent volunteers busy and happy. You can drop them off at MS or our weekly meeting. Thank you to all who help support this minis-

try; yoū are appreciated.

#### **APPLE JUICE RECALL**

Walmart has recalled nearly 10,000 cases of apple juice sold in stores across the U.S. that were found to contain potentially harmful levels of inorganic arsenic. The affected product may temporarily cause adverse health consequences but is unlikely to cause serious or irreversible medical issues.

The recall applies to Great Value brand six-packs of 8-ounce (227-gram) apple juice bottles.

#### **DISASTER PREPAREDNESS SALES TAX** HOLIDAY AUG. 24-SEPT. 6

Consumers can purchase qualifying disaster preparedness supplies exempt from tax during the 2024 Disaster Preparedness Sales Tax Holiday. Passed by the Florida Legislature and signed into law by Gov. Ron DeSantis, the sales tax holiday begins Saturday, June 1, and extends through Friday, June 14. A second exemption period will begin Saturday, Aug. 24, and extend through Friday, Sept. 6.
