As they travel through the pipes, the fabric in wipes mixes with other particles and can remain solid, leading to blockages. Blockages, especially in apartments and multi-home dwellings, cause backups not only in your home, but also in surrounding homes. surrounding homes.

While the Suwannee River will continue to rise as water flows south from Georgia to empty into the Gulf of Mexico, the forecast as of Thursday morning was the river will crest at 45.5 feet on Aug. 15, which will only affect Highsmith Park here in Dowling Park. Our lowest flood stage is 47 feet.

Visit https://water.noaa.gov/gauges/douf1 to keep track of the river level's forecast. On the bottom of that page are flood impacts, which explain at what levels different areas of Dowling Park are affected.

Those who were knocking on doors to advise area residents to evacuate earlier this week were actually in the wrong community; they weren't supposed to be in Dowling Park. At this time, we are not in danger.

Be advised, however, that other areas are experiencing flooding. If you are planning any road trips, it is advised that you attempt to find out if any of the roads you are planning to take are closed due to flooding or damage due to Debby.

As I walked around Monday and Tuesday, speaking with people and "taking the community's temperature", I was heartened by the positive attitudes of most. There were a few grouches, but, mostly, everyone was thankful, patient, and looking on the bright side. A smile is contagious, so thank you for doing your part to keep spirits up during a difficult situation.

Scam Tip of the Week: IRS Scam Scammers pose as IRS agents and call or email potential victims claiming that they owe the IRS and unless they are paid immediately, they will be arrested. The imposters demand that the victim wire money or provide a prepaid debit card in order to pay the taxes and avoid arrest. Know that the IRS will never make first contact via email or over the phone. They will

always make first contact by mail. Should you receive a letter that appears to be from the IRS and it instructs you to call a number, verify online that the number listed in the letter is in fact a number associated with the IRS. The IRS also will never demand that you wire

money or provide a prepaid debit card for payment.

If you believe you are the victim of a scam, file a complaint with the Attorney General's Office online at www.myfloridalegal.com or by phone at 1-866-9-NO-SCAM. You may also file a complaint with the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, which acts as the State's consumer complaint clearinghouse, at www.floridaconsumerhelp.com. **ACV QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS**Do you have a question about the Village you think others would also like to ask? Submit your question to MS, and we will do our best to find out the answer for you and publish it here.

Q: Are there any restrictions on generators for those in rental units?

A: ACV allows renters to use generators. If you are considering getting a generator, please check with Environmental Services (658-5155) to make sure you purchase the correct size for what you need, and that you are operating it correctly/safely. The following are safety tips suggested by the Red Cross:

- To avoid electrocution, keep the generator dry and do not use in rain or wet conditions. Operate it on a dry surface under an open canopy-like structure, such as under a tarp held up on poles. Do not touch the generator with wet hands.
- Be sure to turn the generator off and let it cool down before refueling. Gasoline spilled on hot engine parts could ignite.
- Store fuel for the generator in an approved safety can. Use the type of fuel recommended in the instructions or on the label on the generator. Store the fuel outside of living areas in a locked shed or other protected area. To guard against accidental fire, do not store it near a fuel-burning appliance, such as a natural gas water heater in a garage.
- Plug appliances directly into the generator, or use a heavy duty, outdoor-rated extension cord that is rated (in watts or amps) at least equal to the sum of the connected appliance loads. Check that the entire cord is free of cuts or tears and that the plug has all three prongs, especially a grounding pin.
- Never try to power the house wiring by plugging the generator into a wall outlet. Known as "backfeeding", this practice puts utility workers, your neighbors and your household at risk of electrocution.
- Remember, even a properly connected portable generator can become overloaded, resulting in overheating or generator failure. Be sure to read the instructions. If necessary, stagger the operating times for various equipment to prevent overloads.
- Never use a generator, grill, camp stove or other gasoline, propane, natural gas or charcoal-burning devices inside a home, garage, basement, crawlspace or any partially enclosed area. Keep these devices outdoors, away from doors, windows and vents that could allow carbon monoxide to come indoors. (Opening doors and windows or using fans will not prevent CO buildup in the home. Although CO can't be seen or smelled, it can rapidly lead to full incapacitation and death. Even if you cannot smell exhaust fumes, you may still be exposed to CO. If you start to feel sick, dizzy, or

weak while using a generator, get to fresh air RIGHT AWAY - DO NOT DELAY.)

# FRAUD PREVENTION TIPS

If you can answer "Yes" to any of the following questions, you could be involved in a fraud or are about to be scammed!

- x Are you sending money, gift cards, checks or any money orders to anyone you met online or over the phone?
- x Have you been informed that you are the winner of a lottery, Publisher's Clearing House, or any other prizes?
- x Have you been instructed to wire, send or ship money as soon as possible to pay for a debt or arrest warrant, to bail a family member out of jail, or to take care of an IRS tax debt?
- x Did you respond to an unknown email, text message, or phone call asking to verify any of your personal banking or credit account information or provide your personal information such as name, date of birth, etc.?
- → The IRS, FBI, or any form of U.S. government will not call you, message you, or request that you pay them over the phone or through gift cards, or by mailing cash.
- → If you receive a call stating a loved one or friend is injured, arrested, or in an accident, do not provide any information. Obtain detailed information and call the appropriate authorities to determine if the contact is real or fraudulent.
- → Never provide your personal or any banking information to anyone online or over the phone, or to anyone you do not personally know and can trust with said information.

Sheriff St. John and the deputies of the Suwannee County Sheriff's Office want you to stay informed on the many ways criminals work to scam their victims.
