WIN/WIN SITUATION: **GIVE FROM YOUR IRA**

As you plan your end-of-year giving to organizations that make a difference in people's lives, please consider Advent Christian Village. For a win/win situation, consider giving from your IRA.

If you are over the age of 70½, you can make charitable gifts directly from your IRA. You can donate up to \$105,000 (or \$210,000 for couples) per year from your IRA to a qualified charitable organization like ACV.
What are the benefits to you? The distribution

counts towards your RMD (Required Minimum Distribution), and it does not count as income on your tax return — so it lowers your taxable income. This is especially useful for those who make regular donations but are not able to itemize deductions on their tax return.

Simply contact your account administrator and tell them you would like to send a donation from your IRA to Advent Christian Village, Inc. at P.O. Box 4305, Dowling Park, FL 32064. The check must be made out to Advent Christian Village so that you are not taxed for the distribution.

Ford is "the most decorated veteran from Suwannee County." The Fords' farm was located across from Bixler Memorial Gardens East on CR 136. It was also amazing to hear that most of the reports of Charley's accomplishments on and off the battlefield were classified and only became public knowledge a couple of decades ago despite his death occurring in 1969.

Scam Tip of the Week: Fishing Scams

"Phishing" is a term that describes when online scammers copy the format and look of a legitimate company's website or emails in an attempt to trick unsuspecting individuals to share their usernames, passwords, account numbers, credit card numbers or other sensitive personal information. They often do this by saying the individual must "confirm" or "update" their account information. If you receive an email asking for personal information, do not click any links or reply. Instead, contact that business using a phone number or web address you know to be genuine and confirm whether the email originated from them.

If you believe you are the victim of a scam, file a complaint with the Attorney General's Office online at www.myfloridalegal.com or by phone at 1-866-9-NO-SCAM. You may also file a complaint with the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, which acts as the State's consumer complaint clearinghouse, at www.floridaconsumerhelp.com. "Christmas Traditions" Check It Out at the Village Square

The History Window theme for December is Christmas Traditions at ACV. This five-minute visual presentation describes Christmas traditions that have developed during the 111 year history of Advent *Christmas* Village. For example,

- For 100 years, the Live Oak Rotary Club brought dinner and Santa to the campus, first for the children, and today at Dacier Manor.
- A 94-year tradition is residents receive a free Christmas dinner.
- For 50 years the Christmas Tree Lighting ceremony has served to light the whole campus, and a Chrismon Tree has adorned the church.

- For 24 years the Village president has provided an afternoon Christmas tea.
- For 23 years CCC has sponsored a Parade on Wheels, and camels from the East have joined residents in the Phillips Center entrance.


