WIN/WIN SITUATION: **GIVÉ FROM YOUR IRA**

As you plan your end-of-year giving to organizations that make a difference in people's lives, please consider Advent Christian Village. For a win/win situation, consider giving from your IRA.

If you are over the age of 70½, you can make charitable gifts directly from your IRA. You can donate up to \$105,000 (or \$210,000 for couples) per year from your IRA to a qualified charitable organization like ACV.

What are the benefits to you? The distribution counts towards your RMD (Required Minimum Distribu-tion), and it does not count as income on your tax return — so it lowers your taxable income. This is especially useful for those who make regular donations but are not able to itemize deductions on their tax return.

Simply contact your account administrator and tell them you would like to send a donation from your IRA to Advent Christian Village, Inc. at P.O. Box 4305, Dowling Park, FL 32064. The check must be made out to Advent Christian Village so that you are not taxed for the distribution.

Member Services Tip of the Week The Village asks that if you are doing outdoor Christmas lighting displays at your home that you choose to use all white lights. And if nothing else, a nice spotlight on your front door will add Christmas cheer.

Scam Tip of the Week: Imposter Scams You get a call or an email. It might say you've won a prize. It might seem to come from a government official. Maybe it seems to be from someone you know your grandchild, a relative or a friend. Or maybe it's from someone you feel like you know, but you haven't met in person - say, a person you met online who you've been writing to.

Whatever the story, the request is the same: wire money to pay taxes or fees, or to help someone you care about. But is the person who you think it is? Is there an emergency or a prize? Judging by the com-plaints to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), the answer is no. The person calling you is pretending to be someone else.

Here's what you can do:

- Stop. Check it out before you wire money to anyone. Call the person, the government agency, or someone else you trust. Get the real story. Then decide what to do. No government agency will ever ask you to wire money.
- 2. Pass this information on to a friend. You may not have gotten one of these calls or emails, but the chances are you know someone who has.

Last week I explained the different stages of plarn. I did this to reach out to new people who do not know what the plarn ministry is about. This week I'll tell you a little bit about how the plain ministry is used. Most believe that the finished mats are given to police officers who disperse them to the homeless. While this is true there is so much more to it.

When a disaster occurs, whether it is a hurri-cane, wildfire, flood, tornado or a home fire, these mats are given to the displaced people. The area that is stricken with a disaster will reach out to different plarn ministries to see who has mats and pillows on hand. They may ask for 25 mats and 10 pillows; they go to each plarn ministry to see what they have available.

These disasters could be as close as Live Oak, in other states, or even in other countries. Wouldn't sleeping on a mat be more comfortable than sleeping on the ground or a hard floor? I don't know if you remember a couple of months ago that I mentioned in the FNN that North Carolina was reaching out for some mats, and yes, we donated to them. This is how close to home you could be helping somebody that is in a time of need.

Did you know it takes 500–800 bags to make a mat? Thank you to all the volunteers who make the plarn ministry a success.


THANKSGIVING Submitted by Monica Serlick

- x Are you sending money, gift cards, checks or any money orders to anyone you met online or over the phone?

- x Have you been instructed to wire, send or ship money as soon as possible to pay for a debt or arrest warrant, to bail a family member out of jail, or to take care of an IRS tax debt?
- x Did you respond to an unknown email, text message, or phone call asking to verify any of your personal banking or credit account information or provide your personal information such as name, date of birth, etc.?
- The IRS, FBI, or any form of U.S. government will not call you, message you, or request that you pay them over the phone or through gift cards, or by mailing cash.
- ➔ If you receive a call stating a loved one or friend is injured, arrested, or in an accident, do not provide any information. Obtain detailed information and call the appropriate authorities to determine if the contact is real or fraudulent.
- Never provide your personal or any banking information to anyone online or over the phone, or to anyone you do not personally know and can trust with said information.
